The requirements listed below reflect the undergraduate major curricular changes approved by the Catalog Subcommittee since approval of the last Undergraduate Major Change Bulletin. All changes are underlined. Deletions are crossed out. The column to the far right indicates the date each change becomes effective. Note: Items marked $\{\mathrm{S}\}$ have been streamlined and do not require Catalog Subcommittee review.

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| Agricultural and <br> Food Systems <br> Revise requirements for minor in Agricultural Systems | Agricultural Systems <br> The minor in Agricultural Systems requires a minimum of 18 credits, 9 of which must be upper-division and taken in residence at WSU or through WSU-approved education abroad or educational exchange courses. The requirements are 6 credits from AFS 201, ANIM SCI 101, AFS 101, CROP SCI/HORT 102, and SOIL SCI 101; 3 credits from CROP SCI/HORT 202, ECONS 101 and SOIL SCI 201; and 3 credits each from approved courses in three of four areas: Biotic Influences on Crop Production (CROP SCI 305, ENTOM 343, PL P 429), Economic Aspects of Agricultural Systems (ECONS 350, 351, 352), Sustainability (AFS 336, AGTM 305, SOIL SCI 302, 441, SOIL SCI/AFS 445), and Production (CROP SCI 403, HORT 310, 313, 320, 357, 413, 418, 421). | 8-21 |

Completion of the Game Studies and Design Certificate requires a total of 15 credits. Students are required to complete DTC 392 or 476 and 492 plus 9 credits chosen from one of two options. Students who select the Design Option select three courses ( 9 credits) from DTC 335, 336, 354, and 435.
