16 hours credits with a 2.0 GPA. Including a core of WOMEN ST
201, 369, 484, and 485. In addition, four elective hours selected
fromWOMEN ST 211, 300, 317, 410, 481, 499. At least 9 hours
credits must be-from upper-division work courses and taken in
residence at WSU or through WSU-approved education abroad or
educational exchange courses.
Required core courses (9 credits): WOMEN ST 101 or 120, 369 or
<u>385, <del>,</del> 484,</u> and 485.
Electives: A minimum of 7 credits from any WOMEN ST courses,
except those used as required courses.
